Funders play an important role in promoting responsible data management, data preservation, sharing and citation, in other words FAIR data.

- Well documented and annotated
- Discoverable and accessible
- Integrates easily with other data

Leads to...

- Reliable and transparent research
- Knowledge sharing and innovation
- Follow-on research and opportunities for collaboration





Since 2016

NWO embraced the FAIR principles in its RDM policy as early as 2016. Data as open and FAIR as possible, as closed as necessary.

Harmonising RDM requirements in Europe


In 2018, together with Science Europe, NWO championed international alignment of research data management.



Investing in capacity building for FAIR data

In 2020, NWO funded Dutch universities and other public research institutions to set up or expand on Local Digital Competence Centers.


